TIBETAN MONK GESHE PEMA DORJEE TO SPEAK AT C.W. POST



Geshe Pema Dorjee has devoted his entire life to pondering the nature of love, happiness and compassion. Now he is bringing his words of wisdom to the C.W. Post Campus of Long Island University.

His lecture "Creating Meaning and Happiness in Your Life," will be held on Tuesday, June 1, 1 p.m., in the Hillwood Commons Lecture Hall. Admission is free and the public is invited to attend. Refreshments will be served at the event.

Geshe Pema Dorjee was born in Tibet and escaped to Dharamsala, India where he attained the Geshe degree, the highest degree that can be earned in Tibetan

Buddhism. The Dalai Lama and his Tibetan government-in-exile appointed Geshe Pema Dorjee to various positions including that of spiritual counselor to former political prisoners who had been tortured.

Since then, Geshe Pema Dorjee has devoted most of his time to numerous charitable projects including creating an orphanage, establishing schools, and building bridges. Currently, he organizes teams of international experts to provide agricultural assistance to remote villages and arranges for the sick and injured children from these villages to be brought to modern medical centers.

Geshe Pema Dorjee teaches and lectures in countries all over the world, including Sweden, England, Switzerland, Belgium, Germany, Finland, Norway, France, and Israel. This year marks his second visit to the United States.
